chanic on inspections of our aircraft, shop instruction, and classroom teaching. I feel that I am learning as much or more than I am

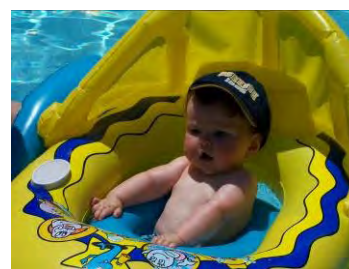

A Mechanic's Musings



One of my first jobs as a new instructor at Moody was to supervise the maintenance specialist class repair this old 1946 Cessna 140.

This airplane had been bolted to a jig in the corner of the hangar for almost six years. Many students were sure that this was just a static fixture holding up the roof. As a class we put in almost 1000 man hours over a month's time and were able to remove it from the jig and let it stand on its wheels again. It was a great project to take this old plane another step closer to being the useful tool it was designed to be.

In our small group this week we were studying 2 Timothy 2:20-26 and I thought of this old plane. In this passage Paul is instructing Timothy on how to be a useful tool. First, he had to get rid of some things like youthful passions and quarrelsome controversies, like we had to get rid of some old parts on our airplane. Then, Timothy was to pursue better things like righteousness, faith, love and peace, like we added new parts to the old airplane. In

aviation terms the type of repairs we accomplished must return the aircraft to its type (original) design. What is our "type design" as Christians? Are we in conformity to it or do we need some repairs? Let's do what it takes to be a useful tool for our Lord.
