## *Financial Update*

2009 and the beginning of 2010 have been **very financially challenging** for our family. Denise's part time job at a Spokane elementary school was eliminated due to county budget cuts. Wayne's Saturday work was not consistent in 2009 and is now nonexistent. PTL that some of this shortfall has been helped by Denise becoming the nursery coordinator at Fourth Memorial Church, and some of our utility expenses have been supplied for by a friend of the family. **THANK YOU!!!** Thankfully the salary that we receive from Proclaim Aviation is a fixed amount that does not go down with lower amounts of financial contributions for our

family. But, at our current salary, we have been **short \$350** in monthly contributions for the last year. Our salary is fixed at our current amount until the shortfall is filled. We have done several things to **lower our budget**. As mentioned earlier Addie is no longer attending the Christian School (we do have back tuition from when she was attending that needs paid). We have canceled all cell phones and our internet connection. We have only basic utilities, no TV cable, etc. **Our basic monthly expenses** include rent, insurance, auto expenses (no car loans), groceries & clothing, a credit card payment (the card has been cut

up) and a few medical bills. We have trimmed expenses almost to extremes; we still find ourselves financially short regularly.

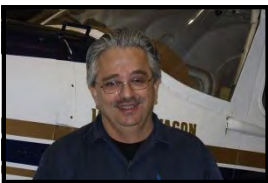

## *Moody News*



The ten fifth-year students graduated on Saturday May 29. Two have applied with mission agencies — Mission Aviation Fellowship and South American Mission, and several are returning to Moody to participate in a post-grad course to receive their **Certified Flight Instructor's licenses**. Please pray for the graduates as they continue to prepare for service in other countries.

In the maintenance hangar we have been mak-

ing some improvements to the facility. We have built **portable computer stations** that will be used at the aircraft during inspections and repairs. We can now access electronic copies of Cessna repair manuals, aircraft inspection checklists and access the internet at the aircraft being serviced.

The aircraft radio lab has received a much needed remodel; it is now a functional avionics lab and a classroom. The engine overhaul shop

has also received some remodeling to make it more useful.

The Cessna T210 mentioned in our last newsletter has made one long trip from Spokane to Phoenix and is currently in the hangar having the last of its maintenance discrepancies repaired. The students have been learning much concerning retractable landing gear repairs and maintenance on a "new to Moody" airplane.
