Students near the end of their training at Moody Aviation take an instrument course, which enables them to pilot the aircraft solely by instruments. This method is most often used inside clouds. More than a long title, (that means nothing to most of the world), becoming a CFII qualifies me to teach this area of the curriculum next spring as needed.
