Training the next generation of missionary aviators

the latest from the hangar

Wayne's fourth-year students took maintenance seminars from January 7 through February 8. Each seminar lasted one week and involved digging deeper into the subjects of aircraft landing gear, troubleshooting, electrical distribution, and aircraft control surface adjustments. Each seminar included classroom teaching in the morning and hangar projects in the afternoon. One of these projects included a Cessna 172R that Moody purchased to replace the aircraft lost in the accident.

Wayne has also been involved with the maintenance Technical Evaluations (TE) for our graduates. Technical Evaluations are part of the application process with various missionary aviation organizations. These organizations evaluate each applicants knowledge, skills, and attributes through a series of rigorous projects and exams. Passing TE is a critical and formidable step to overseas service for our missionary aviators, thus, and Moody conducts TEs for each of its graduates to prepare them for the official version with their respective missions. One TE will be given at the end of February for Mark Bogner and another during March for Lance Kanagy. At the end of 2018 Cody Burns, Steven McMath and Ben Samuelson were given their evaluations. They have been accepted by different various organizations and went on to pass their official technical evaluations given by those organizations. During this process, Wayne calibrated student, staff, and Moody-owned tools, which included 528 torque wrenches, micrometers, scales.

New Flight Simulators. The school has been working with the **Frasca Flight Simulator company** and various contributors for the installation of three new flight simulators. **This multi-million dollar endeavor** includes remodeling the maintenance hangar mezzanine to house the simulators and an additional classroom. These sims will be the first ones built by Frasca with the new avionics and navigation systems manufactured by Garmin. Installation should be complete by early summer 2019, and is another step toward training the and equipping the best missionary aviators.
