

On Sunday, our pastor began a discussion on the Lord's prayer in Matthew 6 and focused on verses 9-10. He was explaining a model of prayer to use leading up to Easter and he talked through the significance of praying "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." It seems like such a simple prayer. If you had asked me in January if this was my attitude toward finding new ministry partners, I would have said "of course!" Our goal is to be servants of Christ now in Spokane and we desire to seek His will daily. The reality is that even though my words proclaim, "your will be done," my heart isn't always quick to follow. If God's will was for us to raise tons of money and have everyone we talk to join our ministry team, I was onboard. When it came to waiting patiently, seeing discouraging times, and being tested in my trust of God's provision, the prayer of, "your will be done," didn't seem quite as appealing.

After the last 2 ½ months of building our ministry team, we have grown to understand that this is about so much more than raising money. Each meeting brought new relationships and we had the opportunity to hear how God was working in so many different lives. We have been able to pray over families and be prayed for by many of them as well. It has been one of the most challenging and faith building times of our marriage and is really setting the stage for what full time ministry looks like. I have a new understanding of "give us this day our daily bread," because this is first time I have committed to a job where the amount of time and effort I put in has little correlation to how much income we receive. I feel silly now to ever think that God would wait to start forming and growing us in ministry until after we finish fundraising and start our "jobs" as missionaries.
