They are working on a ministry airplane Travis worked on in Alaska for many years. This plane is used by a missionary to fly kids from the bush to a Christian summer camp, and to fly into the bush for ministry work. The students each lead a section that involves modifications to the airframe, and replacing the engine with a completely different model. This will allow the missionary more capability, confidence, and reliability in his ministry. It has also given the students invaluable opportunity to see ministry first hand. It is the pinnacle of their training and they are doing well. They will be the first of many, trained to do what Travis was doing in Alaska, replicating aviation ministry around the world.
