It is thrilling to watch the students finally summit the peak of their training at Moody. This is an accomplishment not to be underrated or understated. Moody Aviation's training is meticulously challenging, and yet in many ways, Moody is just the beginning. Moody acts as a sturdy foundation on which students will build their careers as missionary aviators.

July saw us get a short but restful getaway to Cascade, Idaho. We were able to take some time to visit with my family, and Amber's family was able to fly up and join us as well. It was a relaxing retreat after a strenuous semester.

Sometimes Amber can get a respite in the morning or afternoon, depending on whether her students cancel flights or adjust their schedules.

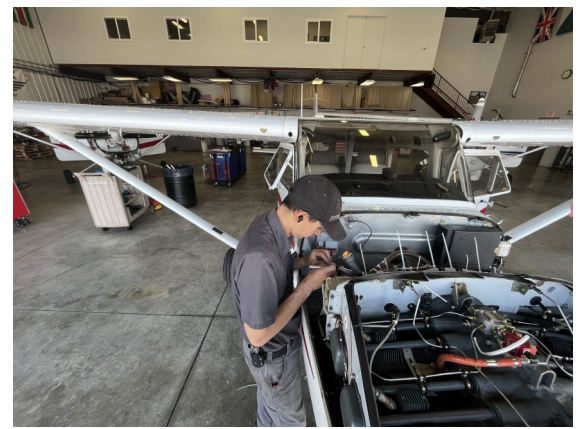
