We are now four months into our family of three, and Artham is happy and gassy. Our sweet boy smiles whenever he's given attention and not excessively tired or uncomfortable. Even in times of persistent crying, he often pauses to give a quick smile before returning to the tears. Caleb has learned the art of efficiently burping a baby as well as creating the perfect positioning for deep sleep on a shoulder. Faith has fine-tuned her recognition of baby sounds to determine just what Artham is requesting at each moment. Since being in daycare, she's also been Artham's soothing antidote on days when the caretaker says he has a particularly hard time.

Faith has enjoyed jumping back into teaching preschoolers' art classes. She creates fun ideas for each lesson while integrating specific projects to support their cognitive recognition of shapes, characters, and lines, as well as their motor development to form them in artistic composition. She has a gift for communicating to these children in a way I've only seen in her. She recognizes just what they pick up on and sets the right expectations for what they won't. She's patient with them and will remind them of instructions as often as needed, given their constant curiosity and still-developing attention spans, which perpetually cause their little minds to drift from tasks. She will be a wonderful mother to our formative boy.

In our family, we previously asked for prayer regarding a relative's recent decisions. We are still very much in need of prayer for that individual and all who are touched by the consequences. We won't give names, but please pray for repentance and reconciliation, as it is concerning a professing believer. To help with this situation, we decided to take a road trip, but we were stopped by a snowstorm at our halfway point. Thankfully, we made it to our intended stay for the night with the faithful extended family of a coworker from Moody. While time was running short for road conditions to improve before we needed to head home, the delay allowed us to spend a full extra day with this family, who provided encouragement and refreshing love, where otherwise our trip was likely to bring heaviness to our hearts while dealing with broken relationships. The trip was ultimately cut short due to persistent road and weather conditions. On the way back, however, we learned of an LDS friend in Spokane who was hospitalized for stage 5 kidney failure. We were unsure of his survival; however, our cancellation of the remainder of the trip allowed us to return home in time for Caleb to visit him just before visiting hours ended for the night. Having had another LDS friend crash in an F-15 accident before speaking with him about the gospel and the atoning sacrifice of Christ, Caleb was able to share with this friend. He was thankfully treated and returned to a sufficient state of health to be released. While still recovering fully, he now lives to care for his wife and four children. Although no supernatural changes seemed to have occurred to awaken a true understanding of Jesus and the salvation he necessarily brings, seeds were planted, and the Lord has since brought several developing relationships to Caleb with LDS missionaries and a new devotion for witnessing to this community.

## Operations Update

Moody class years continue to progress toward the end of the Spring term. Many students are having difficulty passing flight lessons, and consequently, we are working very strategically to structure the daily schedule to provide the best opportunity for each student to complete this term. Our team continues to grow strong in our communication, given the pressures that tempt us toward anxiety and conflict. Recent difficulties in work relationships have since been addressed and resulted in deepened brotherhood and resolve to see our students succeed.
