There's nothing quite like the smile (and slight shock) on a student's face after landing an airplane alone for the first time! It marks the transition from learning to fly to truly becoming a pilot. David was proud of each one and grateful for the opportunity to walk alongside them during this key moment in their aviation journey.

Shortly after, David was reassigned to mentor a new instructor, Destiny, as she worked toward earning her instrument instructor certificate. It was a rewarding shift in roles, as he

moved from teaching students how to fly to now teaching a teacher. Being entrusted with that level of responsibility was both humbling and energizing. And right on the heels of that assignment, David took off — literally — flying a Cessna Skyhawk across the country to North Carolina to support JAARS' Camp Aero.

Camp Aero is a summer camp for teens (ages 15–18) designed to expose them to the world of mission aviation. The days were long and packed, but the week was bursting with energy, curiosity, and excitement. David got to share about flying, maintenance, and the heartbeat behind missions. On the return trip, Hastings was able to fly out and join David, and they made a quick detour to visit her parents. Back in Spokane, it was time to reset and gear up for the fall semester of instrument training.

We squeezed in a short camping and fishing trip before classes began, which gave us space to breathe and reset. Then it was full throttle again. David now has three new instrument students and is back in the simulator with them each day. He's also teaching the Instrument Law ground class and was recently approved by the FAA to give stage checks — a significant milestone that will give

him more opportunities to evaluate students and shape their development.

Meanwhile, Hastings continues to persevere through ongoing health challenges. There have been highs and lows, but recently we discovered that her ferritin levels are dangerously low. With the help of some very generous and caring friends, she has been able to continue testing and begin more targeted treatment. We're hopeful that addressing this specific issue will bring some much-needed relief and energy.
